Francis Executive Teacher Years 3-6. Nicole Merchant (Deputy Principal) and myself are available where needed.



#### **Positive Behaviours for Learning:**

Hughes Primary School has a strong, established commitment to wellbeing for our school community. We aim to support students to connect, succeed and thrive at each stage of their development and learning. To ensure our school has a cohesive and best practice approach to wellbeing we have updated our Safe and Supportive School Practices to reflect our journey of becoming a Positive Behaviour for Learning School. Positive Behaviour for Learning, known as PBL, provides a framework for the whole school community to collectively support the wellbeing of every student. PBL is an evidence-based whole school systems approach where positive social expectations are developed, established and consistently reinforced throughout the school community. At Hughes Primary School, we foster lifelong learners in a respectful and safe environment. Students frequently are acknowledged for demonstrating our expectations of "be safe, be respectful and be a learner". We encourage you to speak with your child about our school expectations and discuss the ways they have been acknowledged. Such prompts for the conversation may include 'positive praise cards', 'I was spotted being a....'stickers', 'PBL Awards', 'Hughie and Bunji'. # Student Injury Insurance and Ambulance Transport

The Education and Training Directorate does not provide any insurance cover for injury, disease or illness to students resulting from school activities or school-organised excursions. Claims for compensation are met where there is a legal liability to do so. Liability is not automatic and depends on the circumstances in which any injury, disease or illness was sustained.

As there is no automatic insurance cover for personal injury if you child is injured at school or during a school organised activity/ excursion you should therefore consider whether taking out personal insurance cover for your child is warranted.

This insurance might cover contingencies including medical/hospital expenses, ambulance transport outside the ACT, and cancellation of transport/accommodation or loss of/damage to luggage.

The ACT Ambulance Service provides free ambulance transport for students who are injured or suddenly become ill at school or during an approved school organised activity within the ACT.

**Multiple Chemical Sensitivities (MCS)** is a condition of consideration at Hughes Primary School. Our school is a chemical/fragrance aware environment.

We consider our cleaning products and processes; first aid management; trigger incitant chemicals/substances such as, perfume, aftershave etc. We seek that you also consider the health of our whole community and avoid bringing/wearing these products in the school environment. Some examples of products containing incitant chemicals are (but not limited to): fragranced toys, lip gloss (particularly those with fragrance), spray deodorant, cleaning products, hand sanitisers, essential oils, paints etc.
