Principal's Message

Positive Education: As part of our implementation of the Geelong Grammar Positive Education curriculum, we have a school wide focus on understanding strengths. Character Strengths can positively influence the way we think, feel and behave.

Through a series of guiding questions, our staff and students are investigating and developing their understanding of character strengths through a variety of learning engagements including: strength spotting in rich literature, identifying their own strengths, undertaking gratitude activities and learning about the aspects of Hope Theory. Luke McKay (our fulltime Youth Worker) led the whole school in a game of Character Strengths Bingo! Great fun!

Protective Behaviours: At Hughes PS, the Protective Behaviours program is an important element of our social and emotional development and wellbeing practices. We aim to ensure students are mindful of the importance of being safe,

feeling safe and talking about it. Safety networks are explored, and two key messages are highlighted.

- We all have the right to feel safe all the time
- Nothing is so awful we can't talk about it with someone.

Playground supervision: At lunch and recess (in addition to the clubs that happen across the school) we have three teachers on playground duty as well as a minimum of two Learning Support Assistants providing targeted support. We also have staff who pop out and play a game of soccer or meet a small group of kids in the garden. So, whilst always a minimum of five staff, we at times see seven or eight staff out with children. Staff on duty wear yellow high visibility vests so that children can identify them easily if help is needed. We encourage children to always seek help from the teacher on duty. The reality is that we sometimes have issues to follow up from unstructured play at break times as all schools do. Children are learning every day and sometimes that learning occurs through making mistakes. We view and value every interaction as a learning experience and know that inappropriate choices are part of learning from time to time.

Principal's Message continued

Our approach to follow up involves these steps:

- collecting information from all children involved - every child's voice is valued;
- determining if a school expectation has been broken;
- discussing with the child what they wanted to achieve and how they could do this more appropriately as well as the impact their choice had on others;
- when relevant, a restorative discussion to talk through what happened, the impact on others and how this will be avoided in future;
- consequences put in place for hurting others, e.g. from time off the playground up to suspension for continued occurrences or extreme violence;
- contact with parents for any issues involving hurting, or ongoing concerns - we want to work in partnership; and
- documentation of the incident on our student administration system.

We have found that use of this very systematic approach helps children to understand what happened, why and how they could use more appropriate strategies to achieve a need. If you would like to discuss this approach in more detail, please get in contact with:

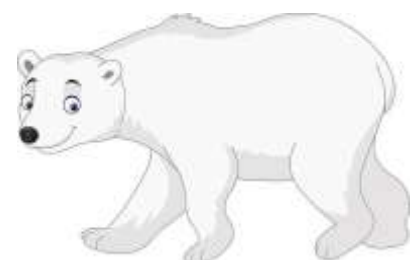
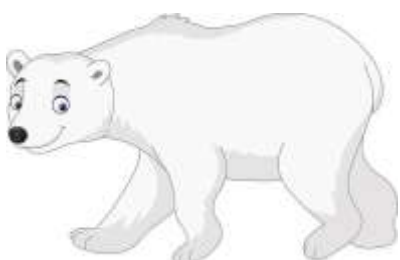


