Principal's Message

Dear Hughes Primary School families and community,

Welcome to the first newsletter for 2020. A special welcome to families who are new to our community. This is a fabulously inclusive community to be a part of and we are so glad that you have joined us. Congratulations to our preschool and kindergarten students who have transitioned so successfully, and to students across the school who have been building positive relationships with peers in their new classes and embracing the learning opportunities on offer thus far. Our year has gotten off to an especially settled start!

We look forward to seeing families Years 1-6 next Wednesday night for our Information Evening (Preschool and Kindergarten information nights were held late 2019). **The first class emails for the year will be sent out next Friday**, with alternate weeks being school newsletters. Each week, families will receive email communication from the school either in the form of a class email or newsletter. If you have any questions or concerns outside of these communication processes, please do not hesitate to get in contact with your child's class teacher.

I am so immensely proud of the courageous Year 6 students who delivered speeches today as part of their bid to be a School Leader for 2020. Each of the students shared their pride about being a part of the Hughes PS community, and talked about what they would do to make our amazing school even better. They also showed gracious support for one another, offering each other quiet words of encouragement and reassurance. Students Years 2-6 cast their votes this afternoon, with results announced early next week.

Staff learning: During the week before school started, staff spent time connecting back together and looking at our strategic priorities

for the year. We joined with Torrens PS to explore our whole school approach to Mathematics and Problem Solving with Dr Paul Swan, and spent time as a staff exploring our approach to Positive Education with Brendan Bailey.

Positive Education: Positive Education brings together the science of Positive Psychology with best practice teaching to encourage and support individuals, schools and communities to flourish. We refer to flourishing as a combination of 'feeling good and doing good'. Positive Education focuses on specific skills that assist students to strengthen their relationships, build positive emotions, enhance personal resilience, promote mindfulness and encourage a healthy lifestyle. Through teaching these valuable life skills, we aim to provide students with an increased capacity to learn effectively, as well as offering them a strong foundation on which they can build a successful life. Our school values will form an important part of our Positive Education journey. Hughes Primary School has a strong vision and mission. We are proud of the inclusive, supportive and connected community of lifelong learners we have here at Hughes PS. **The students can clearly articulate and explain the school expectations of be a learner, be respectful and be safe.** In a recent survey, students in our Upper Primary indicated that no all of them are as connected to our current values of Courage, Achievement, Resilience and Engagement. It is our aim to revisit these values and identify core values that resonate with the whole school community. It is important that these values capture the vision for our community and support the school expectations. We will consult with the school community and through this process, we will either keep the same values and plan ways to make these more meaningful for students, or adopt new values that underpin the work of our school (**look out for the parent survey that will be sent home in next week's class email**).

Reconciliation Garden: To demonstrate our commitment to reconciliation, we are creating a Reconciliation Garden. The garden will serve as a reminder of the importance of grounding learnings, relationships and activities pertaining to reconciliation in truth, and in Country/place, and we hope will grow to become a site where true histories, cultures and contributions of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples can be respectfully shared. Our Reconciliation Garden is inspired by the Bogong Moth. According to an Aboriginal Dreaming Story, the Bogong Moth was once brightly coloured like our native wildflowers. Ignoring her husband's advice, the moth went to explore the mysterious white mountain in the distance. As she neared her destination, snow fell, trapping her. Spring came and as the snow thawed, Myee the Bogong Moth was released. Taking flight, her bright and vibrant colours remained, soaking into the snow and leaving her a dull brown. And where this snow melted, beautiful flowers emerged. **The story serves as a reminder that there is beauty in mistakes. Curiosity and an open and inquiring mind are qualities of the Bogong Moth. These character strengths are qualities present in the lifelong learners of Hughes Primary School students.** We are proud to recognise our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families in the artworks within the Reconciliation Garden. We would like to thank the Monaghan and Pettit family for their support. On Tuesday, students will place handprints in the centre of the main yarning circle surrounded by the words curiosity, inquiry and lifelong learning. This special work highlights our commitment to reconciliation, character strengths and the qualities we value and the inspiration for our Reconciliation Garden. We will have our community working bee early April to plant the wildflowers which will also make this space visually spectacular.

Leadership Team Term 1: Congratulations to Ms Vanessa Valois who will be acting as an executive teacher responsible for the Introductory English Centre and Specialist Teaching Team for the next 8 weeks. I want to thank Ms Suzy Francis for her contributions to the leadership team over the course of 2019. Ms Nicole Merchant will continue to act as the Deputy Principal until Ms Sarah Harris returns from parenting leave at the end of Term 1.

Ms Kirsty Stewart will continue to be the Team Leader Preschool to Year 2; Ms Nicole Merchant will be the Team Leader for Years 3-6; Ms Vanessa Valois will be the Team Leader for IEC and Specialist Teachers (Ms Sarah Harris will take this over upon her return), and I will look after our LSUA as well as my other responsibilities as principal.

Multiple Chemical Sensitivities (MCS): Our school is a chemical/fragrance aware environment. We consider our cleaning products and processes; first aid management; trigger incitant chemicals/substances such as, perfume, aftershave etc. We seek that you also consider the health of our whole community and avoid bringing/wearing these products in the school environment. We are also a Nut Aware school. Please ensure your child's lunchbox contains no nuts, or foods with nuts.

We have decided to open our Franklin Playground in the mornings before school for students in Years 4-6. Students in these grades are also welcome to be on the Bimberi playground with younger siblings and peers if they wish. We will trial this in Term 1 and evaluate its success at the end of the term.

Our school has a highly engaged community and as such we have always enjoyed the support of our parents and carers. As you are aware, public schools receive funding from the ACT Education Directorate. To supplement this funding, schools also seek a voluntary contribution from families each year. We receive further support through the generosity of the school community in their contribution to P&C fundraisers.

At Hughes Primary School the voluntary contribution may be made directly to the school or paid into a Library Trust Fund. Dear School Administration Team,

As we start a new school year, we would like to remind you, parents and students about our services and how to best prepare for travel on both bus and light rail in the new year. Details of all school and regular services are available [online](#) for parents and students to begin planning their journeys.

School routes and services remain unchanged for 2020. Transport Canberra is here to support the safe passage of students to and from school using public transport and active travel options.

To assist in planning school bus travel, use our handy tips and checklist below.

Routes and timetables:

Check the details of services required for your child to and from school, also making sure your child is familiar with the times and stops. If your child is new to school or changing schools, please check available [school services](#) or [regular bus timetables](#) information.

Journey Planner:

The Transport Canberra Journey Planner includes school services, allowing you to plan out the most convenient mode of transport for your trip to school. Use Transport Canberra's [journey planner](#) to plan your travel, and use [NXTBUS](#) to track your awaited service.

MyWay cards:

MyWay is the cheapest and easiest way to travel with Transport Canberra services. A student [MyWay card](#) can be purchased online, over the phone, or at a MyWay Recharge Agent. Adding travel credit is even easier with the options of B-Pay or Autoload direct debit, attracting an additional 5% discount on all fares. Students can also top up their MyWay card or purchase a single or daily ticket at Transport Canberra's new [ticket vending machines](#), available at selected bus stations and Light Rail stops.

When travelling on Transport Canberra services, it is important for students to carry their concession entitlement in addition to their MyWay card as Customer Service Officers regularly check concessions.

Fares:

A single trip school student MyWay fare is now \$1.22 on school days and a single trip school student cash fare costs \$2.50. All information about MyWay and cash fares are available [online](#).

Public Transport Safety:

If your child is new to public transport or a regular user, don't forget safety is a top priority. Make sure your child is familiar with the safety rules for inside and outside their chosen bus or light rail service. For further information on Transport Canberra travel safety, please visit the [Etiquette and Safety](#) and [Staying Safe](#) sections on our website.

School Safety Tips:

A School Crossing Supervisor program has been in place since 2018. School crossing supervisors (lollipop people) assist children to cross roads safely by directing traffic with a stop sign and providing instructions. They also help to manage the flow of pedestrians and motorists at the busiest crossings. For further information on schools participating within the program please refer to our Active Travel page, under [School Crossing Supervisors](#).

Active Travel:

Walking, riding or scooting to school is also a great way to reduce congestion and increase safety around schools. There are several initiatives in place to support families wishing to walk or ride in 2020, including the Ride or Walk to School, Active Streets for Schools and School Crossing Supervisor programs. Part way drop off points near a school, like a local oval or the shops, can be a great option if walking or riding the entire trip is too far.


Student Injury Insurance and Ambulance Transport

The Education and Training Directorate does not provide any insurance cover for injury, disease or illness to students resulting from school activities or school-organised excursions. Claims for compensation are met where there is a legal liability to do so. Liability is not automatic and depends on the circumstances in which any injury, disease or illness was sustained.

As there is no automatic insurance cover for personal injury if your child is injured at school or during a school organised activity/excursion you should therefore consider whether taking out personal insurance cover for your child is warranted.

This insurance might cover contingencies including medical/hospital expenses, ambulance transport outside the ACT, and cancellation of transport/accommodation or loss of/damage to luggage.

The ACT Ambulance Service provides free ambulance transport for students who are injured or suddenly become ill at school or during an approved school organised activity **within the ACT**.
